



Archie Malloch Undergraduate Interns in Public Learning

Value: \$2000 to \$2500 each

Duration: minimum of 150 hours, between 1 May and 31 August

Number of awards available: 2

Application deadline for Summer 2016 Internships: 19 February 2016 (5:00pm)

The Institute for the Public Life of Arts and Ideas (IPLAI) invites applications from McGill undergraduates for the Archie Malloch Internship Award in Public Learning. Up to two awards will be granted for Summer 2016 with a value of \$2000 to \$2500 each. Applicants should be currently in their penultimate year at McGill. (We are unable to fund students who will graduate in June 2016.)

Successful applicants will be affiliated with one of the partner institutions and will develop their training program in collaboration with IPLAI and that institution. Depending on the students' interests and expertise and the current projects of the host institutions, interns may participate in a range of activities, including archival and policy research, exhibit development, educational program development, collections management, theatre production, concert coordination, public outreach, and social advocacy.

Applicants should have a keen interest in interdisciplinarity and the function and relevance of humanities scholarship beyond the academy. The internships will include an element of practical training and experience, but will focus on opportunities for intellectual development in line with IPLAI's pedagogical mandate. Interns will be invited to speak about their experiences in September 2015 at IPLAI. Students are asked to identify clearly which host institution they would like to work with and why (see list on website).

Applicants should submit the following:

- Cover letter/ Statement of interest explaining how this internship would fit with the applicant's goals for academic and professional development, and indicating which of the community partners he or she would most want to work with and why (1-2 pages).
- CV (2 pages max)
- Transcript (unofficial is fine)
- Letter of recommendation from a McGill faculty member (sealed envelope)

Application materials may be sent or delivered to the following address on or before the posted deadline. Hard copies, please. Letters of reference may be sent electronically, but student applications must be hard copies.
